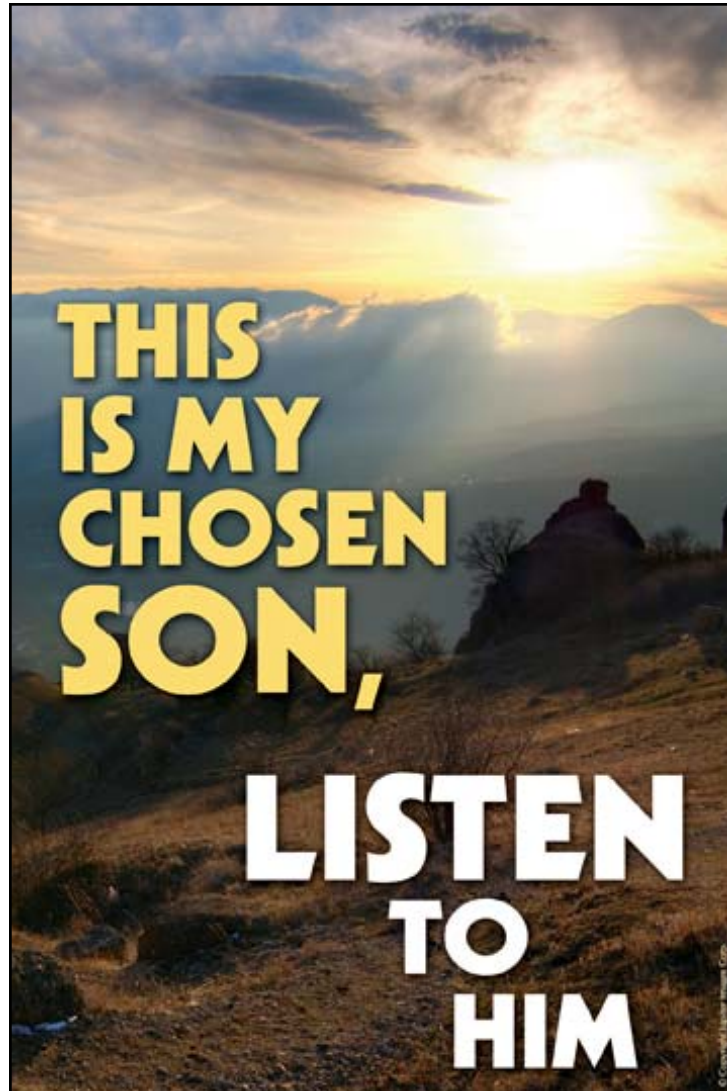

Our annual parish Lenten mission is coming up soon. Our presenter will be Dr. Pauline Viviano, Associate Professor of Theology at Loyola University of Chicago. The theme of the mission will be “Luke’s Gospel as a Guidebook for Our Lenten Journey”.

Lines of Communication

Our original plan was to once again join with St. Norbert in a joint mission. Last year’s endeavor was a great success and it was generally agreed that the experience should be repeated. The dates were set and a mission presenter was arranged for. Everything was going along just fine – then disaster struck: the presenter had to cancel. We cast a net far and wide, but everyone we thought of was already booked for the proposed dates, engaged in studies that would preclude their participation, or otherwise unavailable. St. Norbert decided that a joint venture would be unfeasible since their dates had to be set taking into consideration their school calendar. Finally Dr. Viviano said she could be available if we could tweak the dates. So...

Our Lenten mission will be held on Sunday, March 7th (Dr. Viviano will also give a reflection on the Gospel at our parish Masses that weekend), Tuesday March 9th, and Thursday, March 11th. An opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered after the presentation on the 11th.

Lenten Signs and Sounds

In our culture, people tend to fill their lives with *things*. We fill our closets with clothes and shoes and accessories of every sort; we fill our every waking moment with appointments and lunch dates and television; and we fill our bank accounts with money, money, money. This year at The Brook, it is time to expose the voids. It is time to fast from stuff. I use that word “stuff” deliberately, for many of the things we choose to invest our time and our money towards are merely filler. Lent is a time to fast from these things, and make room for God in our lives.

In our liturgical environment during this Lenten season, you won’t see flowers or vignettes; you’ll see a nearly bare altar platform with simple white candles. You’ll see somber purple highlights throughout the church that represent royalty and the color of the dusk sky. This starkness is meant to increase our focus on the Mass and help us to make our prayer more intentional. Musically, you won’t hear rambling preludes, postludes, or reprises, but silence. This silence creates space for our own thoughts, and ultimately allows us to communicate with God without distraction.

You can continue this sort of fasting in your own life in a variety of ways. Instead of *just* giving up shopping for Lent, go one step further and empty your closets of the things you don’t use and donate them to charity. Instead of *just* giving up chocolate or coffee or any other kind of food, you can donate to our food drive. And don’t give just the food in your cupboard that you’ll probably never use; share your favorite foods with those who don’t have enough. Instead of *just* giving up smoking, donate the money you save to a good cause. Instead of *just* giving up television, spend extra time in prayer or volunteer your time to a worthwhile cause. For every thing that we remove from our lives leaves a void, a void which can potentially be filled with God’s gifts... if we make room for them.

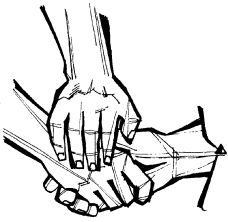

PRAYER + FASTING + ALMSGIVING

Week 2 of Lent: The Transfiguration: Jesus' transfiguration was a moment of hope for the disciples, giving them the strength to endure the future sacrifices they would make as they formed the early Church. As we continue our journey with Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl, let us be mindful that our Lenten sacrifices help to give hope to our brothers and sisters in need.

This year, Our Lady of the Brook suggests two ways to enter into the Lenten and Christian discipline of almsgiving: (1) the Food Drive to benefit the Martin de Porres parish food pantry, and (2) Operation Rice Bowl. Food drive items may be left throughout Lent in the "shopping carts" that are set up in the social area. Rice Bowls can be picked up in the social area and should be returned to OLB on Holy Thursday – and by April 11 (the Second Sunday of Easter) at the latest.

LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. Our US Bishops issued in 1966 this statement on penitential observance: "*On Weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance.*"

Today's Gospel story (Lk 9:28-36) would make a dramatic movie scene! Jesus' friends are dozing off up on a mountain until they see Jesus completely transformed. At this, Peter, James and John become "fully awake" and they proclaim, "Master, it is good that we are here."
