I wish to extend a heartfelt welcome and sincere thank you to Dr. Pauline Viviano for being with us to lead us in this year's Lenten mission. Because of calendar conflicts the mission schedule is a bit unusual: weekend Mass then Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings instead of the more familiar three or four consecutive evenings. If you can't make all three evening sessions please consider attending one or two sessions.

Lines of Communication

Dr. Viviano will present the "Gospel according to Luke as a Guide to Our Lenten Journey". The Church, during this liturgical year, is using Luke's Gospel for most of the Sunday readings. So we thought it appropriate to ask a Lucian scholar to facilitate our mission.

I try to avoid using the terms Luke's gospel, or Matthew's, Mark's or John's gospel for that matter. There is one Gospel, the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The four canonical Gospels are the several evangelists' exposition of that unique Gospel. Each Gospel writer has his own individual presentation depending on his own writing style, the needs of the community for which he was writing, and on the oral traditions that were preserved in his community.

Matthew's account is organized into five sections reminiscent of the five books of the Pentateuch. If the identification of Matthew with Levi the tax collector is accurate this organization skill is well explained. Among Mark's strong points is his brevity: no infancy story and no resurrection account in the original work – the appearances of the risen Christ are later additions by the early church. John is the poet and theologian of the group. The Prologue soars and the Last Supper dialog is very deep indeed. Luke, ah Luke! Here is the master story teller. From the infancy narrative where there is no room at the inn and the infant Jesus is wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger to Calvary where there is the upper room for the Last supper and the slain Jesus is wrapped in burial clothes by Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus and laid in the tomb; Luke is the master of his craft.

Please plan to be here on one or more of the evenings to explore the Gospel according to Luke with Dr. Viviano.

The Burning Bush and the Call of Moses:

Today we hear the call of Moses to lead his people from oppression to freedom. God promises to be with them as they journey to a new life. Our participation in Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl unites us in prayer, fasting, and giving with the millions of people throughout the world who are oppressed by poverty, injustice, war, disease, and lack of education and other opportunities.



This year, Our Lady of the Brook suggests two ways to enter into the Lenten and Christian discipline of almsgiving: (1) the Food Drive to benefit the Martin de Porres parish food pantry, and (2) Operation Rice Bowl. Food drive items may be left throughout Lent in the "shopping carts" that are set up in the social area. Rice Bowls can be picked up in the social area and should be returned to OLB on Holy Thursday – and by April 11 (the Second Sunday of Easter) at the latest.

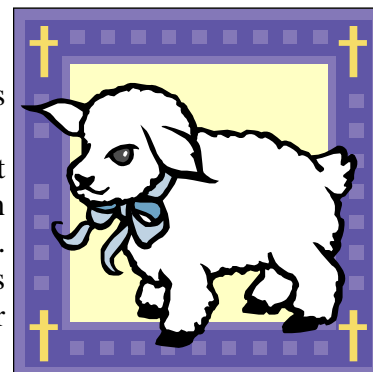

If you have a bulletin in hand, you heard Dr. Pauline Viviano provide her reflections on this Sunday's gospel as a lead-in to her three day presentation: "Luke's Gospel as a Guidebook for Our Lenten Journey".

Evening talk of **Sunday, March 7th**: "*Letting Luke's Gospel Lead Us into Lent*"

In this first talk we will focus on the various themes that come to the fore in the Gospel of Luke and explore how these themes can enhance our own experience of the gospel this Lent. Reading for day #1: Luke 4:16-20

Evening talk of **Tuesday, March 9th**: "*Lessons for the Journey: The Parables of Luke*"

Luke's presentation of the parables serve to underscore the message of salvation that is proclaimed by Jesus. We will explore that message and its implications in this second talk. Reading for day #2: Luke 15:11-32

Evening talk of **Thursday, March 11th**: "*The Journey to Jerusalem: Death and Resurrection in Luke's Gospel*"

In this final talk of the mission we will travel Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, face his death, and stand in wonder at the Resurrection. We will explore what Jesus' death and Resurrection meant for Luke and what these events mean for us today. Reading for day #3: Luke 24:13-31

Each evening there will be an opportunity for dialogue and Q&A with Dr. Viviano. On Thursday, 3/11, there will also be opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation after the presentation. See our posters and website.

LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT

Abstinence from meats is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. Our US Bishops issued in 1966 this statement on penitential observance: *"On Weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass and self-imposed observances of fasting. In light of grave human needs which weigh on the Christian conscience in all seasons, we urge particularly during Lent, generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing of all things needed to translate our duty to penance into a means of implementing the right of the poor to their part of our abundance."*

May it bear fruit in the future

Have you ever taken a Gospel story and applied it to your life? This week's Gospel (Lk 13:1-9) provides an opportunity to examine our faith lives through one of Jesus' parables. In the Gospel story, the landowner wants to cut down a tree that was not producing fruit. The gardener pleads with him, 'Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future.'

Can the fig tree be a metaphor for our faith? Without attention and cultivation our faith lives can feel dry and unproductive which leaves us without joy in the present or hope for the future. These are the comments we have heard from Catholics who have returned since the Catholics Come Home ads aired on television.

There may be someone in your parish that has recently returned to the church and is now attending Mass and receiving the Sacraments. Welcome them to your parish and you may hear their story. The returning Catholics that contact the Office for Evangelization have told about returning to Reconciliation and renewing their commitment to prayer and reading Scripture. These activities have begun to cultivate their faith and already they are experiencing joy and hope.

The newly returned Catholics may have good advice for us all: receive the Sacraments often and spend time with God through prayer and Scripture. Try these practices for a year and see how our faith life can bear much fruit.
