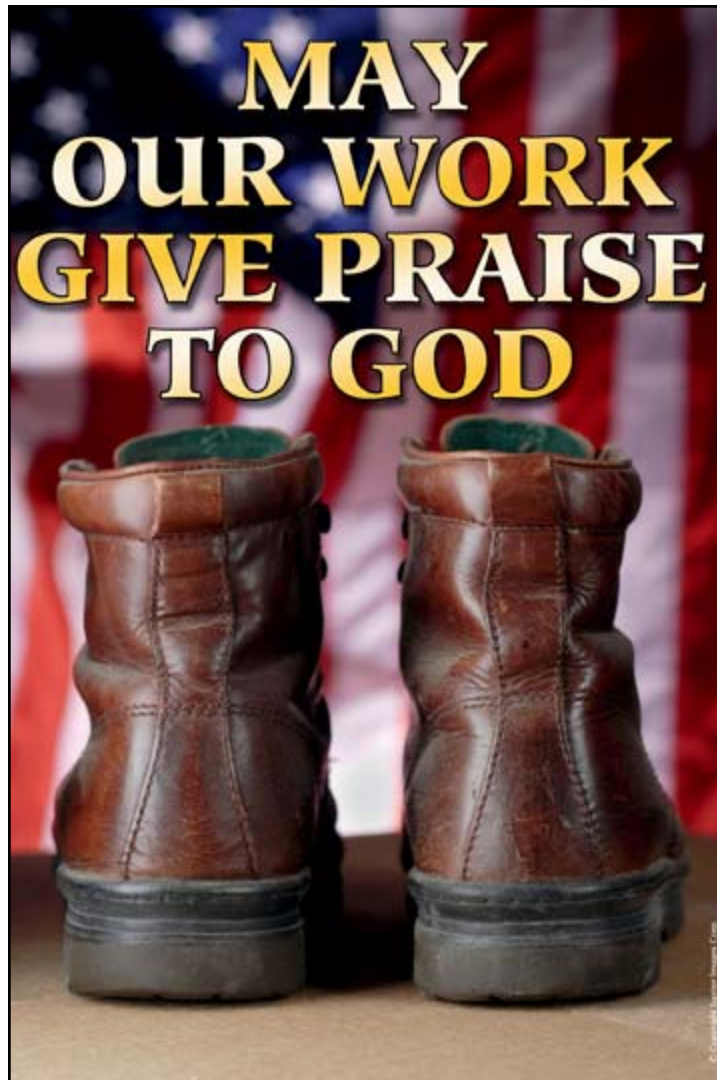

I read an article recently: it was an interview with two rather well known archaeologists who had grown up in the Christian faith but had lost that faith because of their experience as scholars. One of them had become agnostic and the other had become a non-believer. Both of them had been raised in the evangelical tradition and had been taught to believe in the inerrancy of the scriptures. When they discovered that the archaeological record contradicted the Biblical accounts their faith was shaken. When they had to decide between their faith and their science they chose the empirical evidence their science offered.

## *Lines of Communication*

Their faith crisis came, it seems to me, from their belief that the Bible is an inerrant source of either historical or scientific data – at least as twenty-first century people understand history or science.

Our scriptures are a telling of the journey of a people – a chosen people. They are a narration that includes myth, folklore, poetry, fables, fiction, wisdom, biography and history. Often the literary forms are tossed together and because of this, are difficult to recognize. They are primarily a statement of faith and the redactor was more interested in bolstering the peoples' relationship with their God than in recording details of history; also he was an excellent "spin doctor", quite capable of recording biased accounts.

When Christians, or Jews for that matter, whose faith is based solely on the scriptures, i.e. who "believe in the Bible", are confronted by empirical data from the sciences – archaeology, paleontology, evolutionary biology, etc. – they may indeed face a crisis. But when we realize that God speaks to us not only through the scriptures but also through the laws of nature and facts uncovered by the sciences, we can come to a deeper understanding of the relationship between God and his people.

The scriptures are concerned not with geological strata, paleontological fossils, archaeological artifacts, or historical records; but rather with the salvation history of a Chosen People.

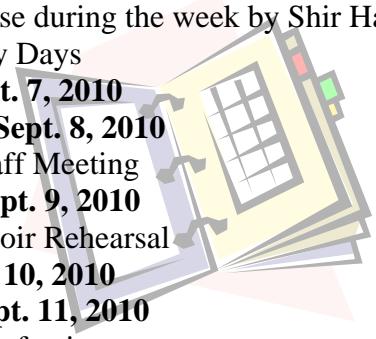

**“Bulletin Building Blocks” - 23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time**

**SAINT PETER CLAVER (1581-1654)**

**September 9**

Nearly two hundred years before the Declaration of Independence proclaimed “that all men are created equal,” two hundred fifty years before the Emancipation Proclamation mandated an end to slavery, three hundred fifty years before Martin Luther King’s “I Have a Dream”, and four hundred years before the election of an American president boasting African heritage, Peter Claver left his native Spain behind to volunteer for the Jesuit missions in Colombia. There, he was horrified both by slavery as an institution and by the inhuman brutality inflicted upon the slaves. He solemnly vowed to become “the slave of the slaves,” and lived that vow heroically for close to forty years. Not knowing their language, Peter began his ministry among the slaves by using the universal language of practical charity, providing medical care and a tangible though wordless assertion of their human dignity: “We spoke to them not with words but with our hands, kneeling beside them, bathing their faces and bodies, encouraging them with friendly gestures” (see *Liturgy of the Hours, Volume 4*, p. 2018). Then came evangelization and baptism. Holiness as human wholeness: Peter Claver’s enduring witness.

## Adult Faith Formation

“Be proud of your Catholic faith. Find ways to learn and grow in understanding of our history and the teachings of the Church. Participate in adult formation in your parish and share all that you learn with others” (Catholics Come Home – Chicago)

Although summer is coming to an end and we will be celebrating Labor Day next weekend, it is time to look to a new season of adult faith formation. This year we will not start our Thursday morning and evening sessions until October. We are doing this for two reasons: Shir Hadash’s celebration of the High Holydays beginning 9/8 with Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur on 9/18 the following week; and Mary Ann and I will be in Germany mid-month attending the Oberammergau Passion Play...a little combined travel and adult faith formation for us.

Our 2011 Fall offering (beginning October 7) on Thursday mornings at 9:15 and again in the evening at 7:00PM is going to continue along the lines Fr. Tom started last year with “The Birth of Monotheism”. This year we’re going to use a video “A History of God” for five sessions to look at the development of monotheism in Judaism, Christianity, and Islam. This video is based on a book of the same name by Karen Armstrong. The book will be a supplement only and not required for the sessions. In 2012 the goal is of have a guest presenter who will give us a more in depth look at our world religions.

Once again we are going to highlight a different aspect of Advent-Christmas by looking at the music of the seasons and the related scriptures on which this music is based. This is a work-in-progress with Jessica so you’ll be hearing more about this in a few months.

There will also be another *Catholics Come Home* venture during the Advent-Christmas season with new materials on TV, the internet, and YouTube. The invitation is a live and well.

In short Ordinary Time (January-February, 2011), we will be looking at the parables of Matthew this year using Fr. John R. Donohue, SJ, book The Gospel in Parable. This is the second year of our three year sequence which began with the study of the parables of Luke. In 2012 we will complete the book looking at the parables of Mark. All are welcome whether you attended last year or not.

Our stated plan is to again have a joint parish mission with St. Norbert’s. We are in the process of our preliminary planning so more to come as we get closer.

During the Seasons of Lent and Easter, we will continue our three-year study of The United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, as recommended by the Bishops in their Pastoral -- “Our Hearts were Burning Within Us “, with Sections II and IV on the sacraments and prayer respectively. Again, all are welcome whether you attended last year or not.

We have also set a date for another Day of Reflection for the women of our parish: Saturday, October 30 to be held at Techny with guest speaker Barbara Flynn who co-authored Midwives of an Unnamed Future: Spirituality for Women in Times of Unprecedented Change (with Mary Ruth Broz...our speaker last Spring). Mark your calendars now!! We will again have copies of the book on sale.

The men’s silent retreat out at Bellermine Retreat Center will again be scheduled for the early Spring.

We have also been invited again to be one of the two host parishes for our Vicariate’s adult confirmation program. We will be hosting these on Tuesday evening at 7:00PM in October and November with the Sacrament of Confirmation being celebrated by Bishop Kane later in that month.

## Rosh Hashanah The Jewish New Year - 5771

The Holiday has several names; they can be interchanged. Rosh Hashanah (head of the year), The Days of Awe, The Ten days of Repentance, and the High Holy Days

Rosh Hashanah begins, on the first day of Tishrei and ends on Yom Kippur, the tenth day of Tishrei. According to tradition, it is during these days that God determines "Who will live and who will die", in the coming year.

The Days of Awe begin with an introspective exam, of who we are in order to see how we have failed God, others and ourselves. Teshuvah (a turning toward God and ourselves) brings repentance.

The Torah, the first five books of the Hebrew Bible, mandates Jews to observe the Holiday: Lev.23: 23-25 & Numbers 29: 1-6

An integral part of the holiday service is the blowing of the Shofar, the ram's horn. It calls the people together. Num.29: 1 The Shofar is linked to the Torah reading. Gen.22 The sacrifice of Isaac was averted through the substitution of a Ram for Abraham's son.

The liturgical themes for Rosh Hashanah are the passing of all humans before God, who decides, "Who shall live and who shall die". There are two books: the book of life and the book of death and each human's name is written in one of these books. On Rosh Hashanah the righteous are written in the book of life and the wicked in the book of death. Those who are either righteous or wicked have until Yom Kippur, to repent before their fate is sealed. Thus Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are linked over the ten-day period.

The voices of the congregation pray that God remembers them for life and writes their names in the Book of Life. (Barbara Wilneff – OLB parishioner)

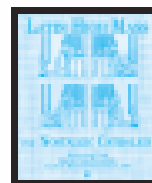
